May Flowers Dress

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I assume you have basic sewing knowledge and the explanation should suffice, but if you need help please email me! Quarter inch seams allowed unless otherwise specified.



I named this dress “May Flowers” since the daffodils are finally up and growing even though our April “showers” were more like April “dump-five-feet-of-snow-overnight” ☺

- **If you're a quilter with a big stash of coordinated fabric scraps, this is a GREAT dress to use them!** The skirt would be especially cute pieced from vertical strips of fabric, and what about another narrow strip of pieced fabric running down the center of the bodice flanked by solids at the sides?
- Add a delicate heirloom touch by embroidering some small flowers around the yoke
- Omit the skirt or replace with a small ruffle of lace for a top





It's a slim fit on an OG with a flush closure in back, and will fit the newer KnC dolls more loosely if closed with an overlap in back. Have an older/bigger AG? You'll notice I included seam lines on the pattern pieces, which I normally don't. For an easier version, cut the yoke and a lining piece on the upper and lower seam lines, leaving shoulder seams intact, and bind edges with bias instead of piping as shown. You can substitute bias for the underarm hem as well, again just cutting off at the seam line.
