Emiko's 4 season wardrobe: Part 4

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Please see seam allowances marked on pattern pieces!





	Wellie Wishers	Hearts for Hearts
Chest	7"	6.5"
Waist	6"	5.75"
Inseam	4.75"	5"

Notes:

- Seam allowances are ¼" unless otherwise specified.
- **Print the patterns with no scaling. There is a mark on each page showing an inch. Match that to a ruler and make sure it's correct.**
- Patterns are designed to close flush in the back, so appropriate closures would be Velcro, buttons with loops or hooks and eyes.

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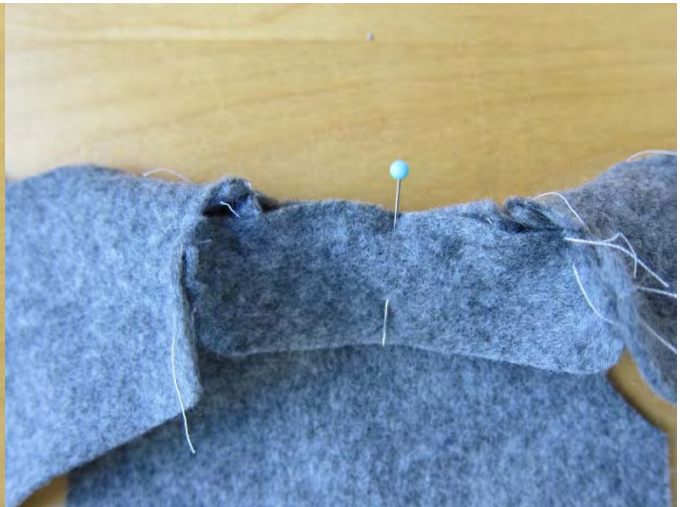
This jacket is a little tricky at the collar the first time you make it. After you've done it once, you can easily whip up a whole batch of these as a school uniform jacket for all your little 14" dolls!

Use lightweight wool or wool-blend felt for best results when steaming the collar. If it's acrylic or a blend, test on scraps first to make sure your iron setting won't melt it!





Sew shoulder seams. Mark center point of back of jacket and collar. Sew one collar edge to the front lapel as shown.



This part is harder to describe than it is to do...pull the collar over and sew the other side to the top of the opposite lapel. Your marked centers can now be lined up and pinned together.



Sew collar to neckline, clip curves. Press to outside by steaming gently with iron barely touching the fabric.



Gather sleeve caps a little and sew in sleeves. At this point, you can topstitch any edges you'd like. I'd suggest minimally the sleeve bottoms so they don't pull out of shape with repeated use.

Sew side seams. Try on doll and mark closure placement. Jacket can hang open or be closed with snaps covered with decorative buttons on the outside.
